I don't know about you, but I feel I am the complete package, when it comes to the O gauge world of trains. I've got all the bases covered... significant real railroading knowledge, I'm highly intelligent and I'm open-minded... when it comes to new things and possess a willingness to learn, I've built up a superb O gauge collection, know how to make an idea come to life, skilled with various hand and power tools, keen understanding of human dynamics and have a way with people, possess an excellent sense of humor, capable and willing to stand up for my beliefs; and I lead, I don't follow and I'm willing to share...

Speaking of sharing, here's a little gift of information for those that hate dealing the batteries found in some locomotive models -

All but one of my MTH locomotives, have NI-CD 2.4V rechargeable batteries in them. The other unit has a 8.4 Ni-Cd rechargeable battery in it.

In 2010, I purchased a number of BCR 2's(battery component replacement devices) and I was waiting for the day one of my locomotives batteries needed to be replaced.

That day came a few weeks ago, and I got to try one of my BCR 2's. It was a fairly simple process to remove the old 2.4V rechargeable battery and replace it with a 3 volt BCR 2. I then put the locomotive on the track powered up my DCS system, waited for approximately one minute, that's required... Wayne can tell you why, then turned on the BCR 2 equipped locomotive.

I'm pleased to say it worked flawlessly, just as Wayne said it would back in 2010. I called Wayne up and told him I was very impressed with his product, the BCR 2's; and I ordered some more of them and a BCR for the 8.4V unit.

BTW, for those that don't know... Wayne developed the BCR/BCR 2 battery replacement devices, and he holds the patents for them.

In case you are interested -

and he sells the 8.4V(basically, 9 volt) BCR for \$24.95 and

the 2.4V(basically, 3 volt) BCR 2 for \$19.95.

NOTE: I have no affiliation with Wayne or his company, I just like his products. They do what they are supposed to do!


